#### **Numbers of Campers Increasing**

Numbers of campers that we have not seen in years have been increasing steadily again and are expected to approach 900 this year. Due to a heavy demand for our youth camps, waiting lists are being experienced with staff attempting to accommodate as many youth as possible.

With covid having put a two year break in our leadership training programs it has been refreshing to see 42 youth register for this year's leadership training programs before June, with a few more spots available. Seven leadership campers were awarded an Alumni Leadership Bursary this year as part of the program.

## LaSalle Secondary Program at JIC Builds a New Bunkie

It began as a five year trial program with Lasalle Secondary School with students in their carpentry program back in the early 2000's. It has resulted in the grade 11 students being involved in the reconstruction of most camper cabins at the camp.



This past spring, the three week session at the camp with the students resulted in the construction of a new Bunkie, used for non cabin staff accommodation. The new bunkie will be named "Lancer Lodge" in honour of the LaSalle Lancer name.

Funds for the Bunkie came from a combination of special grants, the JIC Alumni and the Ontario Trillium Foundation.

#### **Dining Hall Repairs Completed**

The John Island Dining Hall has character! After 71 years of thousands of feet walking, jumping and even dancing within its walls, the dining hall has stood up to just about every imaginable type of activity. To ensure many more years of use are in the building's future, work was completed this year to upgrade some of the beams under the building and modify some of the structure. The work was done quickly but thoroughly by a construction firm and is now ready for the summer of 2025.

#### Fireplace Repairs

An integral part of the John Island Dining hall is the fireplace. Until recent years, the fireplace was used without an insert. When the safety of the stonework became questionable, a medium sized firebox was inserted into the fireplace. This year, work began on the stonework and the fireplace will soon be ready for a chimney insert to bring it back to full use. Alumni financial support as well as the Ontario Trillium Foundation has been playing a role in having this important work done.
